Papa Johns Truck arrives in Wayne County to feed those most in need

Wayne County, NC – As Wayne County continues to respond to this historical flooding event, many relief organizations, religious institutions, businesses and community volunteers have stepped up to assist those most impacted by this dramatic weather event.

This morning, a Papa Johns truck arrived from Louisville, Kentucky, to assist those displaced by high water or currently without power and the ability to cook. The truck, which will be located behind Herman Park Center in Goldsboro, will be able to dish out up to 800 eight inch personal pan pizzas per hour. They will begin serving at 11:00 AM and will operate until 7 PM this evening.

“We are very appreciative of Papa Johns for traveling to Wayne County to help feed our residents who have been majorly impacted by Matthew,” states Mel Powers, Wayne County Emergency Management Director. “These pizzas are free to anyone who needs food and can be distributed individually and in larger volumes for groups assisting those in need. This means, if you are a church helping neighborhoods, a family housing evacuees, or someone whose home is simply without power, we would encourage you to take advantage of this community resource.”

The Papa Johns truck will remain in Wayne County through at least Saturday. It will be located at 910 E. Ash Street in the parking lot behind the Herman Park Center in Goldsboro.
